Grants keep wheels turning

COMMUNITY groups across Campbelltown will continue to thrive following the allocation of funding to promote their projects.

Campbelltown Council presented almost \$8000 in funding to community groups in August.

The latest grants were part of the council's Community Grants program which provides \$16,000 in funding annually.

Groups can apply for a maximum of \$1000 each year to develop and support local programs and

activities. Campbelltown Mayor Paul Lake said the organisations were worthy recipients that represented a broad cross-section of the community.

"Financial assistance, as provided through council's community grants program, goes a long way to assisting small, grassroots organisations in continuing to provide valuable services and activities that benefit and enrich the whole community," Cr Lake said. Recipients

included the Airds/Bradbury Men's Shed, Macquarie Fields Volunteer Network, Ingleburn Country Women's Association, La Voz Drumming Group, Campbelltown Bangla School, Claymore Community Sewing Group, Dinka Language and Cultural Group and My Identity art group.
